2. P5 National Education (NE) Show (Saturday, 05 July)

Since 1997, the National Day Parade (NDP) full dress rehearsal provides an opportunity to grow a sense of belonging and national pride in Primary 5 students, and to give them a preview of the NDP. The aim of the NE Show is to celebrate Singapore's progress as a nation and deepen our youths' appreciation of the Singaporean identity. This year, our Primary 5 students will be participating in the NE Show at The Padang on Saturday, 05 July.

3. Youth Day (Sunday, 06 July)

Youth Day falls on Sunday, 06 July and Monday, 07 July is a scheduled school holiday. All students will report back to school on Tuesday, 08 July.

4. Temperature-Taking Exercise (Wednesday, 09 July)

The school will be conducting our temperature-taking exercise on Wednesday, 09 July. To prepare students for this exercise, there will be a familiarisation exercise on Friday, 04 July. Students should bring their personal thermometers with them to school daily. If your child/ward has lost his/her thermometer, please purchase a replacement thermometer for him/her.

5. Racial Harmony Day (Monday, 21 July)

Schools commemorate Racial Harmony Day (RHD) on 21 July each year to mark the anniversary of the 1964 race riots. It is a day for students to reflect on and celebrate the nation's success as a harmonious society, built on cultural diversity. The 2025 RHD Theme is 'Our People, Our Tapestry'. Our various cultural threads – each representing the unique identities, traditions, beliefs, and practices of our diverse communities – are often intertwined with and complement one another. By always seeking to understand and being respectful of our ethnic and religious communities, we can ensure that our multicultural tapestry remains strong and unified, exemplifying the strength and beauty of our shared heritage and commitment to harmony. On this day, we encourage our students to come to school dressed in their traditional ethnic wear, to celebrate the unique cultural diversity we

have here in Singapore. Students who do not have traditional ethnic wear can continue to report to school in their school uniform or PE attire. During the celebrations, our students will also be engaged in recess fringe activities to let them appreciate the cultural background and identity of self and others. At the same time, students will learn to show sensitivity and openness in interactions with people from diverse social, cultural and religious communities to promote social cohesion.

6. P6 Prelim English and Mother Tongue Languages Oral Exams (Wednesday, 23 July and Thursday, 24 July)

The P6 Prelim English and Mother Tongue Languages Oral Examinations will be conducted on Wednesday, 23 July, and Thursday, 24 July, from 2pm to 5pm. Students will be dismissed from school once they have completed their oral examination for the day. For P6 students taking NTIL, foreign language in-lieu of Mother Tongue Language (MTL) or are exempted from MTL, they will only need to stay back in school on the day of their English or Foundation English oral examination.

7. Primary 5 Cohort Camp 2024 (Monday, 28 July to Wednesday, 30 July)

Our Primary 5 students will be attending their cohort camp on Monday, 28 July to Wednesday, 30 July. This year's camp is held in MOE Labrador Outdoor Adventure Learning Centre and will be residential, with our students staying in 3 days and 2 nights. More details on the camp will be shared to parents and students closer to the date.

8. School Emergency Preparedness Exercise

We wish to inform you that our school will be conducting the second emergency preparedness exercise in July, during school hours. As part of the SGSecure framework to safeguard Singapore and our way of life, this exercise aims to ensure the safety and well-being of all students and staff by preparing them to respond to emergencies in the school premises and be familiar with the safety and evacuation procedures.

SGSecure is a movement to build the resilience of our community and aims to sensitise, train and mobilise the community during emergencies. SGSecure focuses on three core actions [Staying Alert (Vigilance), Staying United (Cohesion), Staying Strong (Resilience)] that every one of us can do during emergencies.

The well-being of all students and staff is important to us. We seek your understanding and support for the upcoming emergency preparedness exercise.

9. Road Safety Advice

The Land Transport Authority (LTA) is carrying out road works to install a sheltered walkway outside Gate A of our school. The work is estimated to be completed at around end July. During this time, directional and information signs will be placed to guide pedestrians. We seek your understanding and support to remind your child/ward to adhere to these signs and observe safety when walking along the road at Gate A.

Railings have also been installed at the centre divider of Yishun Ring Road. For your child's/ward's safety, please remind them to continue to use the signalized pedestrian crossings when crossing the road.

We thank you for your strong partnership with us in your child/ ward's primary education journey. Together, let us develop and nurture our students to be resilient and to strive towards excellence in all that they seek to do.
